

Courage is the story of a group of kids living on Chicago's south side who have to face real lives with real courage.

T'Shawn Rodgers is twelve and determined to join the swimming team as a diver. Most of all, he's determined to impress Carmela Rhodes, the hottest girl in the seventh grade (If you don't believe she is all that, just ask her.)

Overcoming his initial fear of diving off a board is easy. Managing his fears about the return of his older brother from prison is another issue. Once he worshiped Lamont. Lamont helped him deal with their father's death from cancer and encouraged him to be strong. But that was before his brother placed him in danger. Now, after having spent two years in prison, Lamont returns as a scary stranger.

A series of thefts point a finger at his brother, but his own investigation leads him to believe Lamont might be innocent. But he isn't really sure he dares trust his heart and his brother when his friends feel sure Lamont is a menace. He has to protect his mother and sister, even if that means pushing his brother away. After lamont is gone, T'Shawn uncovers

he truth about his strange behavior, he's been helping other kids avoid his own mistakes. The discovery that one of his friends had been framing Lamont leads him to find the strength to apologize to his brother and beg him to come back into his life.

Barbara Binns is an African-American author of contemporary, multicultural stories, born and raised on Chicago's south side. As the eldest of five children, Barbara learned responsibility at an early age. Her eclectic career path includes work as a clinical chemist at the University of Chicago Hospitals, as a computer analyst for AT&T, and now as an author for her readers.

Her books for middle grade and young adult readers include Pull, Being God, and Courage. Her writing has won an Oregon 2010 Readers Choice award and was chosen for the 2012 YALSA Quick Picks for Reluctant Readers list. In addition to writing, she provides lectures and workshops to both experienced and aspiring authors of all ages. She finds writing for young people an exercise in self-discipline and the perfect follow-up to her life as an adoptive parent and cancer survivor. She now lives and writes in a suburb of Chicago.



- In the story, T'Shawn supports a friend who has a debilitating illness -- sickle cell anemia. Some of the symptoms of this painful disease are fatigue, irritability, and swelling of hands and feet. What does T'Shawn's commitment to friendship reveal about his character? Explain your answer.
